Beginning with the Class of 2019, the Seal of Biliteracy recognizes students who are literate and lingual in more than one language (with a proficiency at the intermediate-mid range).

CLASS RANK

Class rank is based on the quality point average of six semesters. Quality points are granted according to the level of the course and the mark earned in it except for pass/fail courses and P.E. Quality point averages are determined by dividing the quality points earned by total credit value of the quality point courses taken. Only students who have attended Lyman Hall High School for six semesters are ranked. All other students receive an approximate rank. All students are ranked on a 4.0 scale with AP and honors courses given a higher weight.
